This newsletter has a lot – get your diary out as you read!-


- The AGM is on the horizon, and we have a great speaker to entertain us after the AGM business.

We are very excited about this opportunity to hold a selling exhibition of members work at; **The Gallery, at Langford Lakes, home of Wiltshire Wildlife,** for the whole of **May and early June.**

From 25th May this will also be part of Salisbury Art Trail adding to the attraction even more.

Artist of the Month – Ron Knight



Our artist of the month is Ron Knight (pictured) is one of our stalwarts of Friday Art. His modesty hides a terrific skill base, producing detailed scenes including delightfully observed people.

He had to be nagged into being our artist of the month and because of that I have been able to see many of his pieces. It has been hard choosing those to include!



Terry - I am always interested in when people discover their flair for painting or drawing and indeed how they take this skill forward during their lives. Have you always practiced art and did it or has it had any impact into your life?

Ron - As a student I stumbled into Art due to a misunderstanding between the school and myself regarding "A Level" choices . With absolutely no knowledge or practical experience of art to discover that I was expected to study for an "A Level" came as an unpleasant surprise. However, as so often happens in life somethings are meant to be and such was the case here.

The head of the art faculty was the artist Peter Folkes to whom I'm hugely indebted. He opened a door for me into the world of art which has been in one form or another, part of my life ever since.

His sink or swim, no nonsense style of teaching made for rapid progress, and I still rely on his teachings today.



That said, I did little practical art work once my school days were over although I always retained an observers interest in art. It wasn't however until I retired that encouraged by my wife I returned to it, (a gap of forty plus years).

Terry - Where do you find your inspiration and what are your favourite subjects and favourite medium?

Ron - Needless to say much had changed with regard to materials and mediums and I experimented with what was available finally settling on water colour pencil and pastel as my medium of choice. Subject matter for me can be anything that sparks my imagination be it Landscape, Portrait or Still Life. I try and rotate subject matter to avoid repetition and to challenge myself.

Terry - Do you have a favourite list of artists and why would these people be on your list?

Ron - Artists that I've admired over the years include Edgar Degas, Paul Cezanne, Wilson Steer, Walter Sickert and Lucian Freud. This is not an exhaustive list but comprise some of those who for me, were inspirational and produced stunning art.

Terry - You are a regular participant at SGA Friday Art. Last week I was asked by a potential new SGA member to describe Friday Art. How would you put those words together?

Ron - I believe SGA Friday Art is an opportunity for like minded people to meet and work together in a relaxed, sociable and informal way. It's welcoming to all regardless of experience or ability and for me provides a necessary impetus to "prep" a work for painting.


Come along to our AGM and enjoy an illustrated talk by member and professional art historian John Elliott on Monet and his Impression, Sunrise.


"In Memorium"


