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Notes from the Editor

In writing this newsletter I am having to put my paints aside. Ask my wife and she will tell you that removing me from my clay, paints and easel is not an easy task. I am lucky being retired that I have time (I think?) to paint and pot more.

Many years ago I worked in a bank in Knightsbridge and other branches elsewhere. Often during a general chat with a customer I would be asked what was my hobby or spare time pursuit. I would reply that I painted. This would often inspire the customer to ask to see some of my work. This had the effect of starting a part time business for me as I, through this, obtained many commissions. At that time as a young man with a young family I was able to add to my earnings. (not quite true but I often say it put shoes on my children's feet.)

So much happened from then till now. We left London and my banking career and travelled to Wiltshire to live and work by and on the Kennet and Avon Canal. Submit one large painting (max size $80 \times 80 \text{ cms}$) for the £6 entry fee, and the second one will be free You may also submit 2 small pictures for £3 in total ($30 \times 30 \text{ cms}$, not including frame).

Artist of the month Beverly Singleton

Your Newsletter Editor catches up to talk to active member artist Beverley Singleton.

As our conversation finished she said the following that I felt I had to share!

'On school holidays now and my mind is racing with colour explosions! Woohoo!'



1. If you were to be interviewed by a local journalist rather than just me the Newsletter editor how would you describe your art? Additionally how important is it to you?

Art to me is all about playing. Sometimes I can have a brilliant time creating something only to get it home and ask myself "What on earth is that ugly monstrosity?!"

I always thought I would be an inventor and painting or felting is fulfilling that desire. It has also been a huge source of therapy and stops my brain from having deep dark thoughts. Now my dreams and waking moments are full of colour and possibilities. My art tends to be from my head and indeed at the April exhibition with Louisa Saffioti this year with 58 hanging only 3 were from photographs.

2. Like a lot of artists in SGA you have to juggle family life with practicing your art - Is this easy and indeed does it add to family life in anyway?

My family are very supportive of me and know how important art is to my well being. My family consists of husband and coroner, Ian, son Matthew (an apprentice carer!), 19 and daughter Georgia 16 (just taken 24 exams for 10 GCSE's!). Plus 3 dogs, a wildlife pond and a very large neglected garden! It looks neglected because I am rubbish at pulling dead plants out especially while birds are feeding off the seed heads; overgrown herbs feeding the bees so can't possibly cut that back! And I can't possibly garden in the rain so my Artwomb it is! Ian very generously had a purpose built studio for me. I tend to use oils there as I can just leave them to dry without transporting them in my overflowing acrylic art car!

3. You are one of the key team at Friday Art. Not everyone has experienced the magic that is Friday art. This sounds perhaps corny but it does have a special place with many of our members. What makes it special?

I used to have Thursdays and Fridays off work to do housework on Thursdays and have time for Friday Art. Alas, I had to increase my salary and work Thursdays - housework definitely takes a back seat! I have often been asked to work Fridays too but Friday Art is too precious. At first the room is quiet with focus but come Josie and Ken's tea and cake time we chat and admire what everyone has been doing. The creativity can get very exciting from David's gold leaf, Jean's needle felting, Martin's master pieces to Jeannie's bottle of Guinness! And what Mairee produced last Friday had a few of us in stitches and sometimes we have cheese and biscuits! If you are thinking about coming along to Friday Art just do it! It's so much fun and friendships are great,

4. Are there any artists or craftspeople in the present or the past that you admire and take inspiration from ?

There was a Russian exhibition in the Queen's gallery a few years ago and because the 6th formers at Bishop Wordsworth's School were studying Russian along we went. There were huge paintings and it was exciting to see the use of colour and brushstrokes. On another school trip to Berlin there was a street where the Art work could be changed every week - I loved that. And the one painting in the National Portrait Gallery which took my breath away and made me cry was of Mo Molem.

5. Would all of your choices in the last question be invited to a fantasy dinner party hosted by you and perhaps who else would you invite. (you can choose persons living or dead.)

Terry asked me who I would have at a fantasy dinner party alive or dead. They would be (not including immediate family or friends) Freddie Mercury - what an innovator he was, Doris Day - her voice is divine, Ellie Simmonds - positive vibes, my nan - she was the warmest and kindest of ladies and used to make gloves, one of my great great great grans - why did she move from Covent Garden - was it to escape the smog, dirty water or work or all three? Statistically one in four were prostitutes at that time! She went on to make straw hats. My mum and grandad on the other side of my family were also artists so I guess it's in the genes.



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
