

Artist of the month – Mark Elling

Your editor talks to Mark to find out more about his style of working and influences.

TK - I understand that you have just retired (if it is a fact that we really do retire!) Did art and its practice feature in your previous employments, I see that you had training as a graphic designer?

Mark - I worked as a graphic designer and tutor after graduating with an MA in Graphics from Leicester University so art and design have featured significantly in my career. I particularly enjoyed teaching art to higher education students sharing

my enthusiasm for all things creative. Today I still get so much pleasure from

being with artists, to encourage each other and be inspired by the wealth of talented people in and around Salisbury.

I don't think I'm alone in saying the covid pandemic unexpectedly provided me with a great opportunity to spend time painting and being inspired by our wonderful countryside. You can see the results of this in my landscapes - especially Salisbury Plain. Whilst my work was originally quite representative I



have been developing a 'looser, more abstract' style under the expert guidance of Karen Welsh as well as researching the many amazing artists online.

TK - OK – you have now 'retired' does this mean the paint box will be tucked under your arm and you will be off seeking inspiration.

Mark - A couple of years ago I was a Wildcard artist on SkyArts Landscape Artist of the Year which pushed me to paint en plein air - something I hadn't done since college days! I'm fortunate to be able to go off and paint in the countryside with my portable box of all essential materials. It's so good to be out and about getting inspired.

TK- Where do you seek inspiration? Is there any particular styles that you want to develop and try?

Mark - I'm a firm believer in going to art galleries to study the paintings particularly my favourites Cezanne, Van Gogh, Carravagio and contemporary artists such as David Inshaw and Fred Ingrams. As I said before, I'm developing a more abstract style and so am studying artists actively producing work I aspire to emulate.



TK - I ask this question a lot of our Artist(s) of the Month. If you were to host a dinner party and were to invite only artists who would they be. They can be dead or alive and why choose them?

Mark - There are so many I'd like to invite but my dining table can only sit 8 people! However here is my guest list:

Turner - because I've always loved his work and I'd like him to know what a huge influence he has been.

Caravaggio - although potentially a disruptive character he would be a lively guest and very interesting.

Tracy Emin - such a brilliant artist and so much to share!

Cezanne - I would like to tell him how much he's inspired me.

Winston Churchill - not an obvious choice but his paintings are so accomplished. He would also be handy to expand the discussion Subject if necessary.

David Inshaw - contemporary and relatively local artist who I'd love to meet. Salvador Dali - because every dinner party should have a surrealist in the mix.

Van Gogh - because I love his work and to suggest he visit the museum in his name in Amsterdam. I doubt he would come to my party as he has so many other invitations!

Eleven Sketchers took the opportunity to visit Wilton House, a location that is on our doorstep yet somewhat overlooked as a good place to draw and paint.


The day turned into a lovely sunny afternoon and the play area and grounds were busy with families enjoying a day out with their children.


